1. The Amerindian / Indigenous Peoples (Section A only)
2. The Spanish Empire in the new World (Section A only)
3. Ways in which the Indians were killed / reasons why
4. Colonization by the French, Dutch and English (breaking Spain's monopoly)
5. Sugar Revolution – reasons for the change from tobacco to sugar, effects of the sugar revolution.
6. West African society in 15th century (Section A only)
7. The trans Atlantic slave trade – how slaves were obtained, the middle passage, effects of the trade
8. Sale of slaves
