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COURSE DESCRIPTION

The Visual Arts area of study encompasses all three domains of learning, namely, cognitive, affective and psychomotor. The pedagogy of the subject covers such topics as the theory and history of art, elements and principles of design and manipulative or practical skills. Visual Art, therefore, is of great relevance to students as it is important for learning and insight to problem solving and creativity, evident in the interpretation of their own work and the work of others. The subject offers students the opportunity to acquire a variety of experiences and skills in the areas of art, craft and design. It also fosters interest and enjoyment in the doing, production and consumption of art and seeks to develop informed citizens and raise the standards of cultural awareness among students. **CXC Visual Arts Syllabus**

COURSE OBJECTIVES

2 Dimensional Expressive Forms (Drawing and Painting)

3 Dimensional Expressive Forms (Sculpture and Ceramics)

modeling, casting, carving, constructing, throwing and assembling, using materials such as clay, stone, wood, metal, and other natural and man-made materials.

- Students should be able to analyze the elements and principles of art identified in examples of sculptural or ceramic forms
- Students should be able to demonstrate through the use of a variety of materials an
 understanding of elements and principles of design as they relate to sculptural and /or
 ceramic forms.
- Students should be able to produce sculptural and/or ceramic forms on given themes using traditional and non-traditional materials.
- Students should be able to use appropriate tools, equipment and techniques in the production of ceramic and sculptural pieces.
